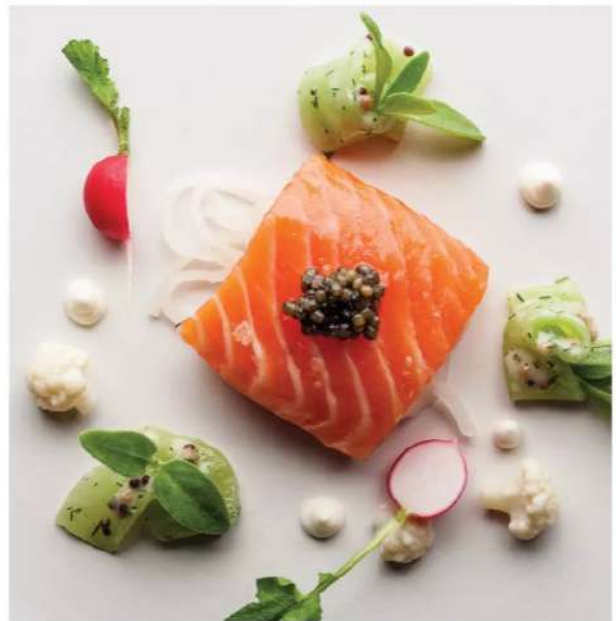

Winston Churchill once roamed the three-acre gardens of Templeton House, cigar in hand, when the mansion on London’s outskirts belonged to his family. Today, the home, which is over 32,000 square feet, with eight bedroom suites, carries the prestigious credential of a Grade II listing on the Historic England register and is selectively available for rental, one of the capital’s grandest private residences. Guests can stroll in its gardens like the former prime minister or swim in the indoor pool attached to the on-site spa; there’s an all-weather tennis court and a cinema, too, as well as a game room with a jukebox and bar. Conveniently, Biggin Hill airport is just a 10-minute helicopter ride away.

A week’s stay here would be rare and sumptuous enough, but

this experience for one *Robb Report* reader and 15 guests comes with a unique bonus: the chance to have a private dinner party cooked by Michelin two-star chef Raymond Blanc. Born in Franche-Comté, Blanc is one of the world’s foremost masters in the kitchen and usually works his magic only at his own restaurant, Belmond le Manoir aux Quat’Saisons, outside Oxford. He’ll make an exception for this occasion, decamping to Templeton House to prepare your meal there. Blanc will personally develop the seven-course dinner, tailored to your preferences, and walk you through each dish himself. *\$331,500 for seven-night stay, including one meal cooked by chef Blanc (excluding wines).
