The show, which opens on Grosvenor Square in London, paints an alluring and effortlessly posh picture of [London](#) in 1813. It's easy to get swept up in the lives of the Bridgertons, with their truly delightful sibling dynamics and *Pride and Prejudice*-esque frocks, and the same could be said for the atmosphere of their regal city manor. As the show unfolds, so too does the scenery, taking us (in horse-drawn carriages, of course) to [Cliveden House](#) and the greater [English countryside](#). Templeton House, London

Templeton House, originally completed in the late 1700s and home to a baroness, reopened in 2019 after a seven-year, \$40 million renovation. Now a magnificent, 28,000-square-foot, eight-bedroom estate available as a vacation rental from [Richstone Properties](#), the iconic Georgian home near Richmond Park looks to be plucked directly from the *Bridgerton* set. And, in reality, the timing, architectural style, and striking interior design—bespoke crystal chandeliers and all—align nicely with the show; so nicely that Templeton House has already been used as a *Downton Abbey* shooting location.
